KUALA LUMPUR: The economy is anticipated to start moderating due to the effects of global eco-nomic instability in the months ahead, said the Statistics Depart-

Citing the Economic Outlook 2023 by the Finance Ministry, chief statistician Datuk Seri Dr Mohd Uzir Mahidin said yester-

In its World Economic Outlook report for October, the IMF projected the global economy to expand albeit at a more moderate

On the domestic front, Malaysia's Leading Index (LI) increased 0.4 per cent to 109.6 points in October compared to 109.2 points in the same month last year.

However, looking at the smoothed long-term trend in Oc-

tober, the LI started trending be-low the 100-point. He said Malaysia's inflation in

October increased four per cent year-on-year, lower than the 4.5 per cent recorded in September, with the food group remaining as the main contributor by register-ing an increase of 7.1 per cent.
